

Call for Application of the Stipendium Hungaricum Dissertation Scholarship for doctoral students graduating in the fall semester of the academic year 2025/2026

1. The Stipendium Hungaricum Scholarship Programme

1.1. Mission statement

The Stipendium Hungaricum Scholarship Programme was launched in 2013 by the Hungarian Government. The primary objective of the programme is to support the internationalisation of Hungarian higher education and its development, to strengthen the international relations of the Hungarian academic and research community, to enhance the cultural diversity of higher education institutions, and to promote the good reputation and competitiveness of Hungarian higher education worldwide. The programme is based on bilateral educational cooperation agreements signed between the Ministries responsible for higher education in the sending countries/territories and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade of Hungary. More than 100 Sending Partners are engaged in the programme on five continents, and the programme's geographical scope is expanding each year.

The programme's core mission is to increase the number of international students in Hungary and encourage Hungarian higher education institutions to attract international students.

Since 2013, the number of Stipendium Hungaricum scholarship holders has increased significantly, contributing to a rise in the proportion of self-funded international students at Hungarian universities. Between 2013 and 2020, the ratio of international students studying in Hungarian higher education doubled, and the ratio of Stipendium Hungaricum scholarship holders among them quadrupled.

The number of both Stipendium Hungaricum applicants and awardees, as well as the number of available scholarship places, continues to increase. In 2025, 80,000 applications were received, and more than 4500 scholarships were awarded – the ratio clearly shows that, since its launch, the Stipendium Hungaricum scholarship has become a programme of excellence.

The Stipendium Hungaricum Programme is overseen by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade and administered by the Tempus Public Foundation (hereinafter referred to as TPF).

1.2. Background of the call for application

Stipendium Hungaricum scholarships are available for bachelor's, master's, one-tier master's, doctoral, and non-degree programmes (preparatory and specialisation courses).

In Hungary, the duration of doctoral programmes is 8 semesters. Doctoral programmes are divided into two phases: the first phase (4 semesters) is for professional training and research, while the second phase (4 semesters) is for research and dissertation.

In compliance with the prevailing Hungarian legislation, Stipendium Hungaricum scholarship holders can request an extension to their scholarship at the end of their bachelor's, master's, and one-tier master's programmes. By law, doctoral programmes may not be extended even if the scholarship holder has successfully obtained their absolutorium and the only step left for them is to acquire their doctoral title by defending their thesis. This separate call for applications aims to provide an opportunity for scholarship holders completing their 4-year doctoral programmes within the framework of the Stipendium Hungaricum Scholarship Programme to complete their dissertations as scholarship holders.

It is important to emphasise that those awarded a Dissertation Scholarship are not eligible for the one-time HUF 400,000 graduation allowance upon completion of their defence.

The Dissertation Scholarship does not extend the already existing Stipendium Hungaricum scholarship status. The purpose of this scholarship is to help doctoral students finish their research and dissertation writing within the scope of the scholarship and acquire a doctoral degree from a Hungarian Doctoral School.

2. The Stipendium Hungaricum Dissertation Scholarship

2.1 Eligibility for the Dissertation Scholarship

Only those Stipendium Hungaricum scholarship holders are eligible to apply

- who obtain their absolutorium in the fall semester of the 2025/2026 academic year (from 1 September 2025 to 31 January 2026), but will finish their dissertation after the end of their student status, and
- for whom it is an absolute necessity to stay in Hungary to finalise their doctoral thesis and research activity
- who obtain the Letter of Justification (see the annexes) at the time of the application, signed by the Supervisor and the Head of the Doctoral School

2.2. Non-Eligibility

Applications will not be considered if

- any of the non-eligibility criteria of the Stipendium Hungaricum scholarship programme applies to the applicant
- the applicant fails to obtain their absolutorium by the end of the fall semester of the 2025/2026 academic year (31st of January 2026)
- the applicant was previously awarded the Dissertation Scholarship

2.3. Duration of the Scholarship

The Dissertation Scholarship starts in February 2026 and lasts for the number of awarded months, but not later than the calendar month of the public defence of the thesis. The Scholarship Holders must start their studies in February 2026, which means that no postponements are allowed.

The maximum duration of the Dissertation Scholarship is five (5) months, but it may not be longer than requested in the application.

The Board of Trustees of TPF will decide the actual duration of the awarded SH Dissertation Scholarship. The duration of the awarded scholarship may be shorter than what the applicant applied for. The duration of the awarded scholarship may not be extended.

The Dissertation Scholarship will be available for the 2025/2026 fall semester application round as follows:

The Stipendium Hungaricum Dissertation Scholarship will be available to all eligible applicants for a minimum duration of 1 month and a maximum duration of 5 months.

2.4 Provisions covered by the scholarship

The scholarship holder shall receive the following provisions over the duration of the Scholarship:

- **Monthly stipend**
 - HUF 43,700 per month during the scholarship period
- **Accommodation contribution**
 - there is no contribution to the accommodation within this scholarship
- **Medical insurance**
 - medical insurance for up to HUF 32,500, arranged by the host institution with a Social Security Card

The monthly stipend shall be paid by the host institution on a monthly basis. These provisions constitute **only a contribution** to the living expenses of the scholarship holder in Hungary, meaning that they may **not fully cover all the living costs** during the scholarship period.

2.5. Application documents for the Dissertation Scholarship

Applicants are required to submit the following documents to the online application system:

- a **letter of justification** from their Supervisor in Hungarian, explaining why the applicant needs the scholarship and why it is necessary for them to stay in Hungary. The letter should contain the Supervisor's professional opinion on the dissertation and the applicant's work in general; the number of months suggested for funding should also be indicated. The letter of justification must be signed by the Supervisor and the Head of the Doctoral School (please note that those applicants who **submit this document in the English language will be automatically rejected**)

- **motivation letter (at least one page)** containing a detailed explanation of their need for the scholarship and the necessity of the scholarship holder's presence in Hungary during the scholarship period
- **monthly work plan** for the proposed scholarship period
- **class plan** for all four classes to be taught by the scholarship holder during the scholarship period
- **absolutorium** (if you have not received this yet from your university, you will have a chance to upload it later, but no later than the last day of the semester, 31 January during the fall semester and 31 August during the spring semester)

Please find all templates in the annex. **The letter of justification must explain why it is essential for the scholarship holder to stay in Hungary for the requested period, and which of the proposed activities cannot be completed online.** The Tempus Public Foundation will not consider applications where the absolute necessity of the applicant's presence in Hungary during the scholarship period is not justified. The scholarship will be awarded only to those applicants who have submitted a complete and well-founded justification, work plan, motivation letter and class plan.

Examples of activities that require personal attendance in Hungary: laboratory work, any research activities at a Hungarian institution (e.g., library, archives), fieldwork, experiments, any research activities that require in-person meetings in Hungary (e.g., interviews, activities at a Hungarian stakeholder that cannot be carried out online), etc. Please note that these examples are provided for illustration purposes only, and the Call for Applications does not encompass all acceptable activities.

All scholarship holders must teach at least four (4) classes during their scholarship period.

The class plan must include all four (4) classes the scholarship holder will teach. The description of each class should be at least half a page long (a total of two pages). The draft must include the title of the class, the main goals and outlines, the teaching method, and a short bibliography.

We have provided templates for all documents, which can be found in the annex. Please ensure that an answer is provided for each of the specified criteria. There is no opportunity to upload missing documents after the application deadline, except for the absolutorium.

The application deadline is 2 December 2025, 14:00 CET.

The online application system can be reached at apply.stipendiumhungaricum.hu. You will need your old DreamApply account, which has been used for your doctoral studies. The applicants must copy their previous applications and the identical fields that are also present in the Appform they completed in the past. The new application they are filling out will be automatically populated for them. **Please do not create a brand new account. Use your previous one. Applicants who create new accounts will not be able to apply. If you encounter any issues with the registration (e.g., you receive a message stating that your application is blocked), please contact stipendiumhungaricum@tpf.hu.**

Applications should be submitted; saved-only applications will not be considered. Please note that no applications will be accepted without an online submission or after the deadline.

2.6 Termination of scholarship status

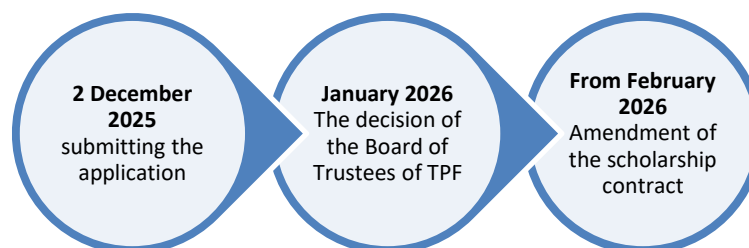
The Dissertation Scholarship holder status automatically expires:

- a) at the end of the award period
- b) at the end of the calendar month of the defence of the thesis
- c) if the scholarship holder leaves the country for more than 10 days

Furthermore, the scholarship status is terminated in full accordance with the relevant provisions of the programme's Operational Regulations.

3. The application process and selection procedure for the Dissertation Scholarship

3.2. Selection Procedure

All required documents need to be submitted to the online application platform by all applicants by 2 December 2025, 14:00 CET. There is no opportunity to upload missing documents after the application deadline, except for the absolutorium. The application platform can be reached at apply.stipendiumhungaricum.hu.

Applications that are only saved in the online system but not submitted will be automatically rejected. The applications successfully submitted to the Tempus Public Foundation's online application system are first subjected to a technical check by TPF. During this stage, TPF verifies the basic eligibility criteria, including the required documents, and checks if the Statement for Application is accepted in the system. In the next stage, submitted applications will be assessed by the Directorate for Study in Hungary of TPF based on the documents received. **For the Dissertation Scholarship, the most important criterion of the decision is the necessity of the applicant's presence in Hungary. Those applications that do not clearly justify the absolute necessity of the applicant's presence in Hungary will be rejected.**

The list of scholarship awardees will be decided upon at the TPF Board of Trustees meeting in January 2026.

The host institutions, the awardees, and the sending partners will have been informed of the final results by the end of January 2026.

In case the applicant is due to obtain their absolutorium during the fall semester of the academic year 2025/2026 (i.e., the absolutorium is expected after the decision of the TPF Board of Trustees), the dissertation scholarship will be awarded conditionally. In this case, the applicant must upload his/her absolutorium by 31 January 2026.

The Tempus Public Foundation's decision is not subject to appeal.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade, which manages the Stipendium Hungaricum Scholarship Programme, reserves the right to suspend the scholarship programme temporarily before or after the deadline for submission of applications or to change the starting date of the training courses specified in this Call for Applications. In this case, applicants will be informed by the Tempus Public Foundation via the online application system and through the Stipendium Hungaricum website. By submitting an application, the applicant acknowledges and accepts this and undertakes not to make any claim for damages or other claims or to assert any claims against the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade or the Tempus Public Foundation in the event of the above-mentioned circumstances. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade and the Tempus Public Foundation shall not be liable for any damages arising from this paragraph.

3.3. Amendment of the scholarship contract

Since the Dissertation Scholarship constitutes a separate form of support, the original SH scholarship agreements of all awarded applicants will be amended.

The amended scholarship agreement – along with all mandatory points set out in the Operational Regulations of the Stipendium Hungaricum Programme – will contain the following:

- the start, duration, and estimated end date of the dissertation scholarship period
- the scope of provisions covered by the dissertation scholarship
